# 2024 Global Survey of School Meal Programs

#### **BACKGROUND**

School meal programs<sup>1</sup> — in which students are provided with snacks, meals, or other foods and beverages in schools—are one of the world's largest safety nets, benefiting over 400 million children worldwide.

The Global Child Nutrition Foundation (GCNF) established the Global Survey of School Meal Programs<sup>®</sup> in 2019<sup>2</sup>. The Global Survey has been implemented twice thus far, capturing information on the school years that began in 2017 and 2020. This has produced the world's most comprehensive and standardized data on school feeding.

The first two rounds of the Global Survey captured information from 155 countries, with detailed information gathered from countries with national or large-scale school meal programs. For the first time, in 2024, countries that report they do not have school meal programs are asked to provide basic information about the country's infrastructure, policies, and any plans for introducing school meal programs.

Data collected through the Global Survey of School Meal Programs are entered into a database and made freely available to all interested users. Global Survey findings from prior rounds are linked below:
