In November 2026, school meal leaders from around the world are invited to Lusaka, Zambia - home to one of Africa's most [dynamic and inspiring school meal programs](#).

Hosted by [Global Child Nutrition Foundation \(GCNF\)](#) and the [Government of the Republic of Zambia](#), the [Global Child Nutrition Forum](#) offers governments and partners tools, knowledge, and global connections to strengthen and sustain nationally-led school meal programs.

School meals reach over 400 million children and represent more than \$67 billion in annual public investment. For partners committed to nutrition, agriculture, education, resilience, or sustainable development, the Forum offers a unique opportunity to engage with the leaders shaping these systems.

This year's theme, *From Vision to Action: Achieving Ambitious School Meal Program Objectives*, focuses on strengthening operational capacity and translating national school meal commitments into effective implementation. The Forum fosters a worldwide network of dedicated professionals, complementing the School Meals Coalition's political momentum with hands-on technical expertise. We invite you to join us in Lusaka as this global community comes together to turn ambition into action.

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## WHY ZAMBIA?

Zambia's school meal story spans decades of dedication and innovation. Zambia's school feeding initiatives now reach over 4.7 million children, with an ambitious goal to serve 6.6 million learners in 2026.

Zambia's national strategy prioritizes sustainable expansion, climate resilience, and dietary diversity. With its proven leadership and deep local engagement, Zambia provides the ideal setting for a global dialogue on scaling home-grown school feeding models.

## WHO ATTENDS THE FORUM?

The Global Child Nutrition Forum is a hands-on learning platform that brings together 250–300 participants from up to 80 countries, including:

- **Government leaders**—the primary audience, representing national school meal program leaders, managers, policymakers, and technical staff.
- **Development partners**—representatives of UN agencies, donor governments, foundations, and financial institutions.
- **NGOs/CSOs**—such as CRS, Counterpart International, GAIN, Global Communities, Nascent Solutions, Mary’s Meals, Plan International, SNV, World Vision International, and others.
- **Multi-stakeholder platform representatives**—such as the School Meals Coalition, Scaling Up Nutrition (SUN), the Alliance Against Hunger and Poverty, the Alliance Against Hunger, and the SDG2 Advocacy Hub.
- **Academia and research institutions**—specializing in nutrition, food systems, and social protection.
- **Private sector partners**—allies in food production, processing, packaging, fortification, logistics, and other related products and services.



## THE AGENDA

Participants will engage in technical workshops, research presentations, and site visits to Zambian schools, culminating in a Forum Communiqué outlining government priorities for global attention.

The Forum agenda is driven by government-identified priorities from the [Global Survey of School Meal Programs](#), input from a wide range of stakeholders, and emerging global trends.

### Objectives

- 1. Strengthen operational capacity** for program implementation and expansion.
- 2. Provide technical knowledge, tools, and connections** for translating national school meal commitments into effective implementation.
- 3. Foster peer-to-peer learning and collaboration** within and between stakeholders (governments, partners, industry, researchers, and advocates).
- 4. Translate global knowledge and research into actionable strategies** for durable large-scale school meal programs.

### Emerging Agenda Themes

#### Youth Engagement and School Food Environments

Addressing rising obesity and diet-related disease by improving school food environments, reducing reliance on ultra-processed foods, and engaging youth as agents of change.

#### Crisis, Displacement, and Vulnerable Populations

Examining how school meals reach children affected by crisis and displacement and using evidence from fragile and displacement settings to strengthen program planning and implementation.

#### Sustainable Local Supply and Nutrition Innovation

Expanding the role of diversified, nutritious foods (including fish, heritage crops, and whole grains), through public and institutional procurement policies that emphasize local food, small- and medium-size farms and enterprises, food safety, and environmental considerations.

#### Inclusive Economic Opportunity and Job Creation

Using school meal programs to build skills, develop local enterprise, and formalize employment - particularly for women and youth - across the food value chain.
